- Barriers making access to treatment difficult:




Nai Zindagi (NZ) is responding with integrated, community-based healthcare

A HOLISTIC, INTEGRATED MODEL

- NZ embeds HCV care into its harm reduction services.
- Seamlessly links prevention, screening, treatment, and follow-up.
- Designed to meet PWID where they are physically and socially.

SCREENING

ROUTINE HCV SCREENING IN HARM REDUCTION

- In 2024, HCV testing became standard in NZ's outreach.
- To Date:

26,880
People Tested

10,540
Found HCV Positive

This proactive screening process has enabled quicker identification and intervention

TREATMENT MODEL

FROM DIAGNOSIS TO CURE

- NZ Partnered with Aga Khan Hospital & Medical College Foundation
- Operating the 'Holistic Care Model' in 40 priority districts



PRISON OUTREACH

REACHING THE UNREACHED

- Extending services to incarcerated PWID
- This intervention ensures healthcare access for those typically left behind
